WITH the same excellent specification as the rest of the Quasar range, the 556 offers superb holiday accommodation for a family of six. A fully-lined shower cubicle and a low MTPLM of 1499 kg makes this a very desirable model for families wanting a larger tourer but on a single axle, and with the ability to tow it behind a smaller car.

The 556 is another Lunar that may not have the most exciting looks, but it's smartly styled and looks modern. A barbecue point and exterior mains socket are just two of the Quasar's features.

This double dinette model offers a fair amount of storage and living space for

a family of six. The front dinette provides very comfortable accommodation, and a chest of drawers comes as standard. Access flaps for seat lockers make bedding storage easier while the front dinette also offers all-round roof locker storage. Fittings include spot lamps and ceiling lamps plus extra mains units.

In the kitchen, you won't be disappointed with the full oven, microwave and Thetford fridge - although the hob has only three burners. The worktop is superb and so is the storage, but the stainless steel sink/drainer just looks odd, and would look better flush-fitting with a glass lid. This would also add to the worktop space.

The wardrobe is fitted next to the washroom, and Lunar have managed to make this a little larger than the average Quasar wardrobe. The Truma heater, fitted below, will keep the caravan nice and warm with twin front air ducts and another one usefully fitted at the rear.

The washroom comes as a bit of a surprise because it's roomy and has a separate cubicle for the shower. Lunar have added plenty of storage, and it's very neatly designed.

The rear of the Quasar is great because it makes a great place for the kids to play in on wet days, and transforms into twin side bunks by night. It has four spotlights and a ceiling lamp, while the decent-sized rear window lets in plenty of natural light.

At the rear are more roof lockers, so storage is well catered for, and there's another chest of drawers with a fold-out coffee table. Access locker flaps and a mains socket are also fitted here. It feels very spacious, and the large side windows enhance this effect. The rear end can be screened off, but the rest of the Quasar won't feel cheated of length.



Side washroom is pretty good, with a separate shower cubicle; another heater outlet is placed here.

Verdict

The Quasar 556 is a full family model offering plenty of space for six. It has plenty of roof lockers, super storage and a decent-sized side washroom with separate shower cubicle. Mains lights are supplemented by 12-volt ceiling lights and spotlights, and they're fitted just where you need them. This is another lightweight family model with built-in quality and practical design.
